Maldivian

No romanization system for Maldivian (Divehi) has been approved at the United Nations conferences on the standardization of geographical names.

In 1987 the Maldivian government adopted a system for the romanization of Maldivian. It was also approved by the BGN and the PCGN in 1988. Minor modifications to the system were introduced in 2009. Notes on its application have been adapted from the BGN/PCGN table.

Maldivian is written from right to left. Vowels are marked as diacritical marks accompanying a consonant character.

- Characters n and r word-finally and before a digraph are romanized h, e.g. وَوَرُ Veyvah, وَوَرُ رُ Kerehdhoo. In other cases, when n and r are used, the romanized value of the following consonant character is doubled, e.g. مَرْضُ batteh, وَمَرْضُ Kalhehuttaa.
